Shared Tower Telecommunications Tower proposal

A telecommunications tower proposal has been received from Shared Tower Inc. The telecommunications tower will handle cell phone traffic in

After some discussion about suitable locations for the 96-foot-tall tower with a company representative, CAO Holland recommends the greenspace between Lot 14 and Lot 11 for the telecommunications tower. This takes the telecommunications tower out of the residential zone and places it into the Light Industrial zone. The proposed site is zoned Park; however, telecommunications towers are allowed in all zones. However, by placing it on the south side of Langley Avenue it will be less intrusive. The treed surroundings should soften the appearance to the tower, while not impacting the function of the tower.

A discussion followed.

MOVED/SECONDED to authorize the use of the greenspace off Langley Avenue for the use of this commercial development.

Fire Response to rural properties

The Village's responsibility for fire events in rural areas was brought up for discussion. There have been several fires outside of the municipality in recent months. Due to various factors, the Fraser Lake Fire Department has responded. Some of those factors have included the potential for loss of life, requests from Wildfire BC due to anticipated delayed arrival of their crews and the extremely dry conditions. For each response, costs were incurred. For the past couple of fires, the Fraser Lake Fire Department responded due to high hazard of wind and the dry weather. They protected exposures and limited the spread of fire.

Fire Chief Pacheco added that Nadleh Macro also responded to these fires and have been a huge asset with their water trucks and additional help.

Do these calls for assistance from Rural residents indicate a new level of interest for fire services? What are the next steps that should be taken with the RDBN? Reimbursement for materials expended during these responses have been discussed with Area Director Mark Parker. Director Parker has recommended a grant in aid application.

A discussion followed.

Council advised CAO Holland to reach out to Regional Director Mark Parker to set up a meeting and then return to Council with an update.

Mayor Storey commented on the power outage on July 4, 2023. She lost cell service. She feels the Village needs to develop a location where people can look for or find information in the case of an emergency when they may not be able to connect to the internet.

Fire Chief Pacheco commented on the use of Voyent Alert! Voyent is a mass notification system that can be used in case of an emergency.

Councillor Webb commented on the use of social media to find information.

CAO Holland advised the Village has posted information at different areas in the community to keep the public informed on things like forest fires.

Mayor Storey would like to see those sites advertised to ensure people know where to seek information in emergencies.

Councillor Jenkinson asked whether the gravel left on the roads from the chip sealing is normally swept off or if it just remains on the road. He also asked about the inside corner by the beach along Park Drive.

CAO Holland stated that Park Drive will be swept, however, not immediately. The gravel will be left on the surface to allow material to be pushed into the chip sealing material.
