Mayor Storey

Mayor Storey met with RDBN Electoral Area D Director Mark Parker to discuss the future of the Village of Fraser Lake. Mayor Storey feels it was a good discussion. Mayor Storey and Director Mark Parker have committed to scheduling monthly informal discussions related to best ways to move the Fraser Lake area forward.

Mayor Storey spoke with Darren Clark of the DMM Group. The DMM Group deploys telecommunications equipment. They are planning to install a cell phone tower in the Fraser Lake area.

Mayor Storey attended the "Evening at the Nechako" event. The presentation talked of local waterways.

Mayor Storey met with Chris King. He has offered assistance to the Village and our new Economic Development Officer when that person is in place.

Mayor Storey attended NCLGA meetings this past Saturday and Sunday. There is a lot of concern regarding decriminalization of personal use of narcotics.

Mayor Storey attended a meeting with Minister Kang, Minister of Municipal Affairs. The Minister made positive comments about the RBA.

Mayor Storey was interviewed by the Auditors from KPMG.

March 1st Mayor Storey participated in a meeting with the Drone project team. They are looking for more money for Phase II. Mayor Storey has offered to assist them in that endeavour.

Budget Planning:

Director of Finance L McMaster presented a report titled 2022 Year in Review. DOF McMaster advised the 2022 budget is adequate for the expenditures in that year. The report provided the list of capital projects and purchases undertaken in 2022, what was budgeted and the final cost of those projects. In 2022 the Village was the recipient of \$101,364 through the Community Works Grant, \$468,000 from the Small Community Grant, \$20,833 from UBCM, \$5,000 from NDIT, \$50,291 from NKDF and another \$647,985 from other miscellaneous grant funding sources.

In 2022, the Community Forest generated \$3,907,690.00 in revenue for the Village.

The 2022 Year in Review concluded with an update on the status of the various Village financial reserves.

DOF McMaster presented the 2023 provisional budget. The capital projects and capital expenditures presented to council have been fit into the budget, along with the proposal for a 6 percent cost of living adjustment in response to the high rate of inflation over the past year.

CAO Holland referred to the Staff recommended Capital Project and Expenditure report that had been provided to Council. CAO Holland noted that Director of Public Works, Vern Hilman had attended the meeting to answer any questions Council may have about the proposed projects. CAO Holland noted that paving and seal coating was not on the

Capital Projects and Capital expenditure list as we have not yet obtained a firm quote from the contractors. However, Director of Public Works V. Hilman has completed some rough calculations and is able to provide Council with an educated guesstimate of the cost of paving or seal coating.

Mayor Storey noted the province has promised funding to the Village of Fraser Lake and that funding could be used to pave or seal coat some of our streets.

Mayor Storey commented on the Cost-of-Living allowance. She reports having made inquiries with many other community leaders and most are responding to the impacts of inflation quite differently than the Village of Fraser Lake. Mayor Storey asked Council for their thoughts on where to go with that issue.

A brief discussion followed. It was agreed this discussion should occur in-camera.

Council's attention turned to paving versus seal coating. Mayor Storey noted that many of the residents would like to see our streets and roads paved or improved.

CAO Holland and Director of Public Works V. Hilman presented an aerial overview of the Village. The infrastructure in Fraser Lake is located under our roads. In addition, many of our roads have limited gravel in roadbed. Many of the Village roads were constructed immediately over a clay base. Because of that, they are susceptible to frost heaving.

Administration recommends the paving of Carrier Crescent, Tunasa Crescent and Nulki Street from Highway 16 to Endako Avenue. The paving project would include the paving of Endako Avenue from Carrier Crescent to Tunasa Crescent, minus the stretch of Endako that was paved last year. The recommended areas do not heave during spring thaw. Pavement is most likely to last in those areas with extensive prepared to the roadbed before paving.

Island Paving will be in Fraser Lake this summer. They will be seal coating Francois Lake Road for YRB. CAO Holland contacted Island Paving and spoke with their crew foreman. The information through this conversation was provided to Council regarding the benefits and disadvantages of seal coating. The cost of seal coating is less than the cost of paving. Paving is \$49.00 per square meter. Seal coating is \$5.00 to \$10.00 per square meter. Double that if applied over gravel.

Mayor Storey commented on the issues that occurred after Chief Lake Road was seal coated in 2018 and the heat-dome happened. The seal coating peeled off the asphalt surface and glued to the tires of vehicles and shoes of pedestrian. Mayor Storey does not want to see this happen in Fraser Lake.

Councillor LePoidevin responded. It is suspected there were issues with the application process. He does not feel that should be a concern.

Councillor Jenkinson stated he is in support of seal coating as it is a more economical alternative to paving.

Councillor Webb suggested a combination of both paving and seal coating. She would like to see Park Drive seal coated from Tunasa Crescent to the cul de sac at the end. Referring to the funding the province has promised, she would like to go as far as that funding will allow.

Director of Public Works V. Hilman was asked for his comments. He replied the roadbed is a significant concern. The lack of drainage is the second concern. Without proper roadbed and drainage, the road will heave and break up.

Mayor Storey commented on potholes. She would like to see the pot hole Contractor return to fill in potholes again this year. Those that were repaired last year have held up very well.

Councillor Webb asked if it is possible to have the roadbed assessed?

CAO Holland advised funding to conduct a road assessment throughout the community was applied for. That funding has not yet been released. When the road assessment has been completed, the Village will have a engineer recommended plan of what needs to be repaired.

Director of Public Works V. Hilman explained that the areas being recommended for paving are the better, more stable sections of road in the Village.

Councillor LePoidevin agreed. He feels all the main roads off Highway 16 should be paved as he does not feel seal coating would hold up.

Council has asked for a quote for seal coating Park Drive, the Boat Launch parking lot and the White Swan Park parking lot. On a separate quote they would like to know the cost of seal coating the stretch of road adjacent to Mouse Mountain Elementary.

Council would also like a quote for paving Carrier, Nulki and Tunasa Crescent to Endako Avenue and completion of the paving of Endako Avenue from Tunasa Crescent to Carrier Crescent.

CAO Holland noted, the money promised by the province has not yet been received. That funding can be used for paving and sealcoating. When the quotes are received, Council can decide how much to spend on paving or seal coating.

Capital Projects and Expenditures:

Director of Finance repeated her earlier statement that all projects on this list have been accounted for in the 2023 provisional budget.

Wastewater Aeration:

Water and Sewer Rates:

DOF McMaster brought Council's attention to the holdings in the water and sewer reserves. Most of those contributions are due to water sales and wastewater management fees. In 2022 Council increased the water levy to \$0.30 per month per user over the actual cost of producing the water. Water sales are offsetting that position and the projected surplus for water in 2023 is \$26,925.

For wastewater, the margin created by the rates are much slimmer. The projected surplus for 2023 wastewater revenues is \$226.00. This slim margin will quickly disappear if the cost of anything relative to wastewater increases. Inflation will undoubtably impact sewer costs in 2023. Sewer rates are required to fund all sewer costs. The cost of supplies or materials must be considered in levied sewer rates.
