A Community-Driven Strategic Plan

The planning session is an essential step for council to establish its Vision, Mission and Values in guiding the municipality. In order to focus on the most important work and ensure that it gets done, not everything can be started and completed. With limited resources, capacity and funding, it is vital that the community manage these to its full potential.

The Strategic Plan does not detail the day-to-day work of the municipality, instead it identifies key priorities to focus on. At a strategic level, these priorities guide the expenditure of funds and decision-making moving forward.


