Our Community

The Village of Fraser Lake

The Village of Fraser Lake is nestled in the heart of some of British Columbia's most beautiful scenery and on the traditional territories of the Nadleh Whut'en and Stelat'en First Nation people. The area has over 170 lakes within a 50 mile radius. It's a playground of water and natural wonderland, where you can try your luck for trophy size trout or char. An abundance of big game, migratory birds and world class fly-fishing, spin casting and canoeing, make Fraser Lake a fabulous outdoor four season recreation community.

Hiking trails begin right at the Village's doorstep atop Mouse Mountain. Enjoy a nice stroll around the base of Mouse Mountain or challenge yourself to reach the top where the views make the hike worthwhile. In the winter months the lower Mouse Mountain trails convert into snowshoeing and x-country ski trails. Other area trails such as Cheslatta Falls 59 km south on the Holly Cross Forest Service Road and Fraser Mountain 14km east on highway 16 offer breath taking views and spectacular waterfalls. Both are definitely a must do while in the area.

From its humble beginnings in the early 1900's, the development of the Grand Trunk Railway now know as CN put Fraser Lake on the map. In 1919 Fraser Lake Sawmills (now owned and operated by West Fraser Timber Company Ltd.) started operations on the lakeshore which is now called White Swan Park. The sawmill outgrew the Fraser Lake location and in the late 1970's moved to their current location 6km east of Fraser Lake. Fraser Lake Sawmills is currently the Village's largest employer and has evolved into one of the world's most modern sawmills.

In 1966 Endako Mines 18km west of Fraser Lake began operations. Molybdenum is the mines main focus. Endako Mine was at one time the second largest Molybdenum Mine in the world and was the Village's largest employer until December of 2015 when the mine was placed into care and maintenance due to low commodity prices. The mine still remains in this state. With the development of Endako Mine the Village of Fraser Lake was incorporated September 27, 1966. The mayor and four councillors make up the governance body of the municipality. Today 1026 residents call Fraser Lake home.

Area Communities

Fort Fraser

Located 19km east of Fraser Lake on Highway 16, Fort Fraser is one of the oldest settlements in British Columbia. It was established by Simon Fraser in September, 1806. Some of the first farming in British Columbia was done here. Fort Fraser was the meeting point at which the Grand Trunk and Pacific Railway were joined after working from the west coast, and from Jasper to the east. This is why the Last Spike is known in Ft Fraser. The town was a major centre during the construction of the railway, with a population of 3000 plus. It is now a small town of 450, employed mainly in the forest industry.

Endako

Endako is located 14km west of Fraser Lake on Highway 16. It was a major railway centre for many years. It was the divisional point for the railway services, with a large locomotive round house and the tallest water tower on the CN railroad. 150 people live in Endako, working mainly in Forestry and Mining. VIA Rail has a stop at the Endako Whistlestop Lodge.

Nadleh Whut'en First Nation

Nadleh is located 16km east of Fraser Lake on Highway 16. We are the 'people who live where the salmon return'. We have lived on our lands since time immemorial. The current population is 500, with a little under half of which live on the Reserve. The Clans of the Nadleh Whut'en are: Lhtseh'yoo (frog), Dunttem'yoo (bear), Luksilyoo (caribou) Lhtsumus'yoo (owl, grouse), Tsayoo (beaver).

Stellat'en First Nation

Stellaquo is located 4km west of Fraser Lake on Highway 16. Stellat'en (people of Stella) has existed since time immemorial. The fertile land between Fraser Lake and Vanderhoof is the basin of glacial Lake. Stellaquo is located at the confluence between two rivers: the Stellaquo and Endako. Stellat'en First Nation has 506 registered members. There are approximately an equal number of members on and off reserve.

Points of Interest

Red Rock—Tselkin

The trail head is located in Stellaquo. This sacred mountain boasts amazing views of the Stellaquo community and Fraser Lake. Before you hike this, all visitors are required to stop and check-in at the band office.

Fraser Mountain - Katzis Yus

The old wildfire lookout tower is located on the top of this mountain from which one can experience a beautiful view of Fraser Lake and the surrounding area. A forestry access road goes to the top of the mountain and is open during the summer. There is also a hiking trail to the top.

Fraser Lake Museum & Visitor Information Centre

This lovely log building has many artifacts of the history of Fraser Lake and area. Located next to the arena. Open during May to September.

Francois Lake - Neda Bun

One of the largest and deepest lakes in British Columbia, it is approximately 125km (78 miles) long. This lake has an abundance of Char, Rainbow Trout, Kokanee and White Fish. There are several resorts and lodges located on the northeast corner of the lake. Which is located 11km west of Fraser Lake.



Points of Interest

Kenny Dam & Cheslatta Falls

Kenny Dam was built in the early 1950's, by Alcan, at which time it was the largest rock filled dam in the world. The dam is 1500 feet long, 317 feet high, and is 40 feet wide at its crest. It took 4,016,900 cubic yards of material to construct the dam, and raised the water 300 feet at its face. To give you some idea of the quantity of materials used, it would fill a line of 12 yard dump trucks (bumper to bumper), stretching from Vancouver to Halifax. It is accessible by a well constructed forest access road which starts at Lejac, 6km east of Fraser Lake and goes South. This road is known as the Holy Cross #1 Road, with the dam located at 68km and Cheslatta Falls at 59km. Both sights are well worth the drive to visit.

Mouse Mountain - Lhkw'echis cho

Located within the Village of Fraser Lake, this area has a number of hiking trails. From the top, one gets a panoramic view of the town and the lake. Mouse Mountain is the shape of a very large mouse when seen from the hill east of Lejac, or from Stellako Village on the west end of Fraser Lake.



Nautley River - Nadleh Koh

One of the shortest rivers in the world, running out of Fraser Lake and into the Nechako River, all within a distance of 0.8 km (half a mile). On the bridge in August, one can see Sockeye Salmon and a few Spring Salmon coming up the river into Fraser Lake and on up to the Stellako River and beyond. There salmon are often in very large schools and the river seems to be solid fish at times. Also from the bridge, you can see the Trumpeter Swans - to the east at the mouth of the river. These swans have been wintering here for many years and they are a beautiful sight to see.

Points of Interest

Nechako River - Ne cha koh

The Nechako River is one of the major tributaries of the Fraser River watershed system, prior to the construction of Kenny Dam in the early 1950's. Now it is a much subdued river, but still flows through some very scenic country. It is a lovely river for kayaking or canoeing.

Nithi River - Nihti koh

This small river runs into the south east corner of Francois Lake, and it is noted for the Trout run in the first part of the spring. At this time, the trout move up the Nithi River to spawn and are very plentiful.

Ormond Creek Trail - Nooz koh ti

This trail goes up the east side of the creek. It is about 10km through the forest, from Fraser Lake to Ormond and Oona Lakes. By hiking this trail, you will see the canyon of Ormond Creek. This creek used to be called Canyon Creek. The canyon is 40-50 feet deep and is about 150 yards long. Along the way you will see some of the massive old fir trees that were burned in a forest fire many years ago. It is a very enjoyable walk.

Pictographs

The north side of Fraser Lake hosts several First Nations pictographs. There are three sets within a 1000 yard area on the north side of the lake. The paintings are on granite rock—the first set facing west, and the next two facing south. The final set is easily visible from the lake and is about 15 feet above low water level.



Points of Interest

Stellako River

The river runs between Francois Lake and Fraser Lake. The Stellako River is world renown for trophy Rainbow Trout fly fishing. This 11km river offers an experience of a lifetime. Many folks float the river in late July to September when the water levels fall. If you float the river you will discover deep crystal clear pools that dreams are made of throughout the journey. In late August to October the Fraser River Sockeye return to spawn. Be sure to bring your camera as it is quite a site.

White Swan Park—Tsi dzilh dzulh (where Canoes were made)

Located on Fraser Lake off of Park Drive, in the Village of Fraser Lake. This lakeside community park offers walking trails, beach, children's playground, exercise equipment, 11 RV site campground, boat launch, covered stage, picnic shelter, washrooms, canoe and paddle board rentals and lots of grassy areas to relax on.
