The National Day of Mourning is observed in Canada on April 28th. It commemorates workers who have been killed, injured or suffered illness due to workplace related hazards and incidents. The ceremony will be held on **Friday, April 26th 2019, at 10:30 am at White Swan Park**. There will be delegates from the Fraser Lake Fire Rescue and the Village of Fraser Lake. The purpose of the Day of Mourning is two-fold—to remember and honor those lives lost or injured and to renew commitment to improving health and safety in the workplace—to prevent further deaths, injuries and diseases from work.
